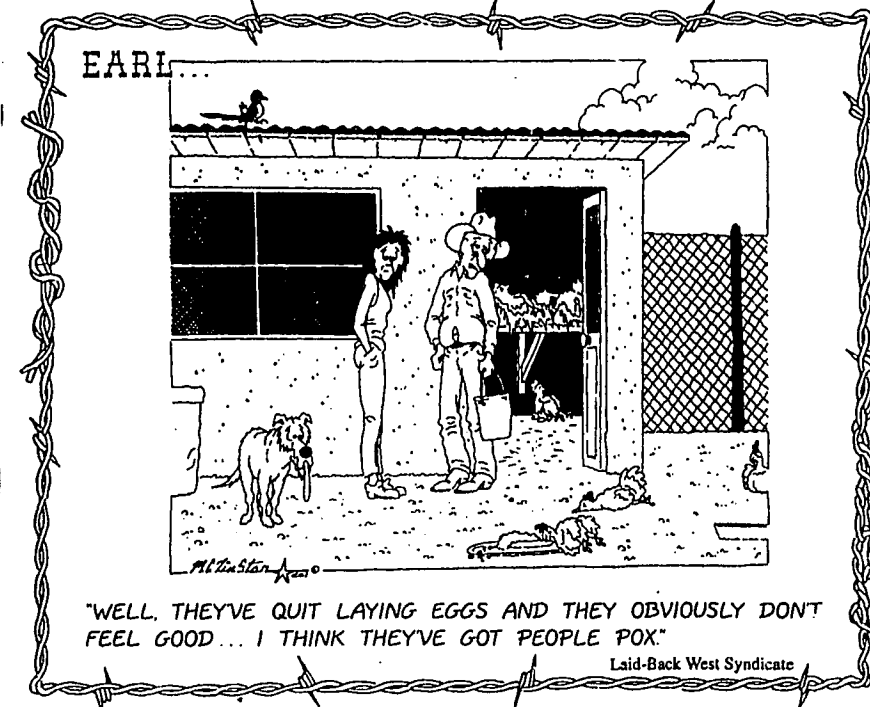

On November 2, 2001, James and Karen Loconte filed an application for the transfer of a license to be used at UPPER DECK SPORTS BAR AND GRILL (former Upper Deck Sports Bar), 3027 Highway 83 - Lazy Pine Mall Units F, G & N, Seeley Lake, Missoula County, Montana.

Protests against an application must be (1) made in writing, (2) mailed to the Department of Revenue, Liquor Licensing, PO Box 1712, Helena, Montana 59624-1712, and (3) received and date stamped by the Department no later than the 13th day of January, 2002. Protests will be accepted from creditors of the transferor or from residents of the county from which the application originates and of adjoining counties only.

Each protestor is required to mail a separate letter of protest. Each letter must be signed by the protestor. Protest petitions bearing the names and signatures of more than one protestor will not be considered. Protest letters must provide the license number, trade name, or applicant name associated with the license being protested for identification purposes. Protest letters must contain a clear statement of the writer's intent to protest the application. The grounds for protest of an application for a transfer of location are limited to those set

out in section 16-4-405, MCA, for a denial of a license, and public convenience and necessity as set out in section 16-4-204, MCA. If the protested application is for a transfer of ownership not involving a transfer of location, the grounds for protest are limited to those set out in section 16-4-405, MCA. Protest letters which do not provide the information described in this paragraph will not be considered valid protest letters. Only those grounds for protest raised in valid protest letters will be considered at hearing. An individual's testimony will be limited to the grounds for protest raised in that individual's protest letter.

If the department receives a sufficient number of protests to trigger a hearing pursuant to section 16-4-207(4)(a), MCA, a hearing will be scheduled in Helena, Montana. If the department receives a sufficient number of protests to trigger a hearing pursuant to section 16-4-207(4)(b), MCA, to determine public convenience and necessity, a hearing will be held in the county in which the proposed premises is located. All qualified protestors will be notified of the time, date and location of the hearing. Hearings are typically scheduled within 90 days following the protest deadline.

If a sufficient number of protests to trigger a hearing are not received and all licensing criteria have been satisfied, the department may issue the license without holding a hearing.

Tentative Hunting Regulations to be Discussed on Jan. 8

Before the first shots were fired in the general big-game hunting season last fall, Montana Fish, Wildlife & Parks (FWP) biologists were preparing written justifications for tentative changes in the regulations for next hunting season.

And, although it could be argued that the biologists were working blindfolded without knowing what the hunting harvest would be, it is necessary to begin the season-setting process early. This allows the Montana Fish, Wildlife & Parks Commission to review the justifications in November, recommend any changes they might deem appropriate, and approve a tentative regulations proposal in December for

public comment prior to finalizing the regulations in February. As soon as the gavel falls to end the February Commission meeting, the race is on at FWP's Helena and regional headquarters to make sometimes massive changes in the tentative regulations booklets, proof them for errors, and have the regulations printed and available to the public in time for hunters to meet spring application deadlines for special permits.

January is your time in the season-setting process. It's when FWP takes its proposals out to you for your reactions and comments. And, it's a time when FWP biologists and managers get writer's cramp from bouts of feverish note-taking when the discussions at local public meetings get lively.

Game Range Ramblings

Because our primary purpose is to carry your comments and concerns back for the Commission to consider in their final decisions in February.

This year, the Seeley Lake meeting is scheduled for 7:00 P.M. on Tuesday evening, January 8, at the Community Center. If you can't make the Seeley meeting, you'll have another chance at Ovando (January 7, Ovando Church, 7:00 P.M.), Missoula (January 11, Double Tree Hotel, 7:00 P.M.), Helmsville (January 14, Community Club, 7:00 P.M.), or any of the others that you'll find listed on FWP's Internet home page (www.fwp.state.mt.us).

Sometimes, I hear people say that it doesn't matter what they think—FWP will just do what it wants anyway. For most people, I think what they really mean to say is, "I work all day (or night) and I've got a lot of things to do at home, or I just want to relax in the evening, so I really don't need another meeting to fill my time." It's a point that rings true to me. So, what you need to know is, "How bad can FWP mess up my life if I'm not at the meeting to defend it?"

You be the judge. This year, FWP's proposal for a brow-lined bull regulation in elk Hunting District 285 (Clearwater drainage) is back on the table, after being withdrawn in February last year. Also, FWP proposes to increase antlerless A-7 elk licenses from 50 to 100 in HD 285. For white-tailed deer, FWP proposes to issue 100 B-tags for antlerless deer in HD 285, and 50 in HD 292 (up from zero in both districts last year). Otherwise, we propose no further tinkering with hunting regulations in the Seeley Lake area.

And, the way things are looking (weather permitting), we may come to the meeting in Seeley Lake with fresh data from the 2002 helicopter survey of elk and deer on the Blackfoot-Clearwater Game Range. I hope it works out that way.

Now, there may be a few of you who feel that the public is paying professional wildlife managers to make good recommendations based on sound scientific data, so why should the public attempt to influence these recommendations? There are several answers to that hypothetical question, but one is that wildlife biology is not the only factor that must be considered in setting hunting regulations. Often, wildlife populations can tolerate a fairly wide array of hunting regulation types, and there is no single correct biological answer. So, the decision often boils down to public input about the kinds of hunting experiences they desire, or the amount of game damage they can tolerate on their private lands, or other social considerations. We especially need your help with these issues.

It is also true that FWP benefits from hearing your impressions of wildlife abundance (or lack thereof). For example, the high calf:cow ratios that Jack Rich obtained in the Bob Marshall last fall, and that I reported here a few weeks later, have led us to develop

some theories about where and when elk calves are most vulnerable to predators, and how our management might affect this. For some species, such as moose for example, FWP has poor survey data of its own, and such data is very expensive to collect. So, your personal observations of moose help us evaluate whether our very cautious and conservative harvest quotas for moose are still allowable.

One thing is for sure. If you don't lend your voice to the public comment process, you are in effect giving your voice to those who do. One year, not long ago, five people at Seeley Lake provided all the local input we received to set seasons across half-a-million acres in the Clearwater drainage for thousands of hunters!

And, what changes have FWP made in response to public input lately? Last year, the big one was the proposed brow-lined bull (BTB) elk regulation for HDs 283 (Gold Creek), 285 (Seeley), and 292 (Garnet/Chamberlain). We came to the local meetings with this recommendation in hand, based on low bull:cow ratios in HD 283 and the western 2/3 of 292, and on a need for consistency with surrounding BTB districts in HD 285. Folks at Seeley have a history of interest in a BTB regulation, but were divided on the issue last January. By the end of the meeting, however, it seemed there was a consensus in favor of the change to BTB.

The Helmsville meeting was a dif-



ferent matter entirely. Landowners pointed out that there was no problem with low bull:cow ratios on the east slope of the Garnets, and that saving spikes from harvest would just increase the already intolerably high game damage on their lands. Based on this input, FWP withdrew its BTB recommendation for 2001. This year, we propose to more fully address the public input we heard last year by recommending BTB for all of HDs 283 and 285, but only for the west half of 292 (west of the Garnet Range Road). Elk biology will support either a BTB or any-bull regulation in these hunting districts. The decision will be made on the basis of public desires, and public input.

I'm pushing my space limitations as I hasten to add that black bear hunters in the Seeley Lake area have not received what they've been asking for. The May 15 closure of the spring black bear season is based on harvest data and limited other clues that make us worry a bit about black bear populations. These data need to be tested, and that's exactly what is happening with FWP's black bear study in the Swan Valley. In a couple of years when results start coming in, we hope to have a better understanding of the status of local black bear populations, and at that time we may be in a better position to recommend changes in spring bear hunting.

Here's hoping I see you on January 8th!

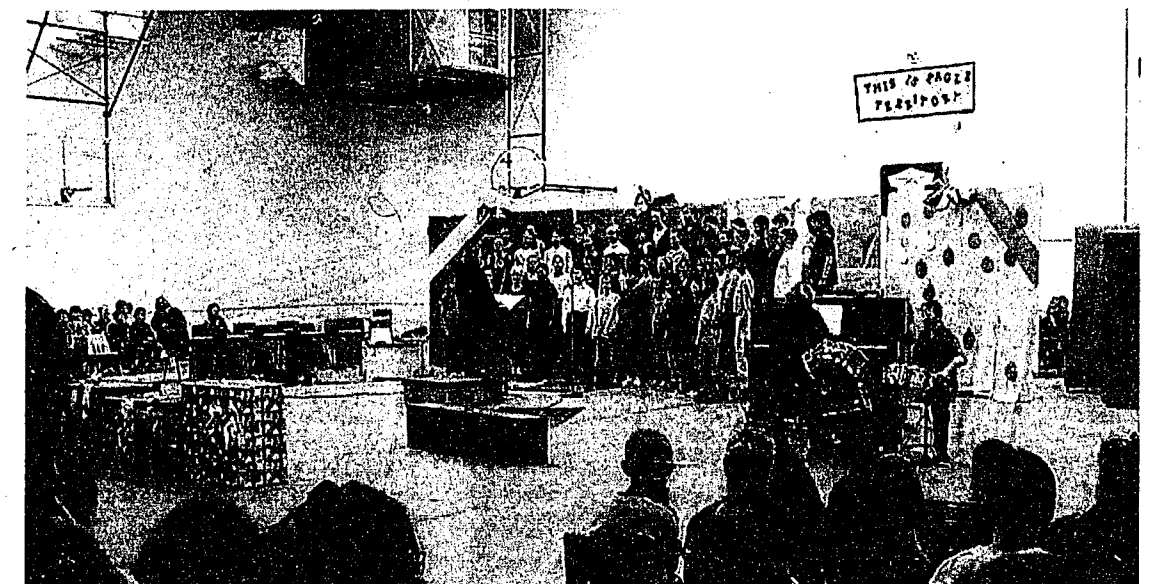

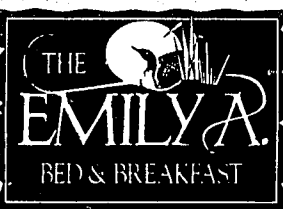

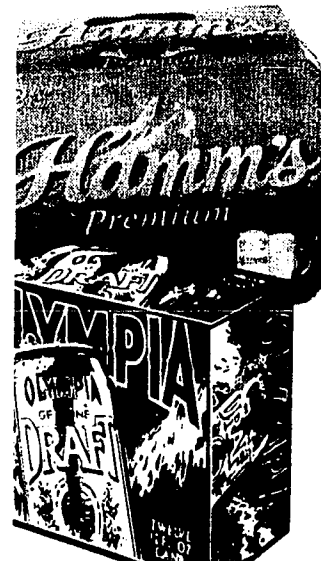
