# Elk on Public Land Merit Special Attention

by Mike Thompson

Upon entering Trixi's Antler Saloon, in Ovando, Montana, you stand at a crossroads between elk the social world of elk, as in that populations, and in the eye of a of human beings, it matters who storm in elk management.

No one knows for sure how elk sort themselves into "herdunits," as wildlife biologists refer to them. They are defined by distinct winter ranges, in this case the Blackfoot-Clearwater Game Range to the northwest, and the eastern slopes of the Garnet Range eventually meets a group of to the south. And, when elk scatter Helmville elk in the meadow from these two separate winter ranges in summer, ne'er the two

Parenthetically, I might mention that field work for a prize-winning dissertation could be accomplished while sitting at Trixi's bar on a warm spring season, and watching through the open door until a group of Game Range elk across the parking lot.

Would separation of the herdunits be defended overtly, with cows rearing up on their hind legs and striking at each other with their forelegs? Or, would aloof dignity be maintained at all times?

It surely would require several days at the bar to discern this.

At this time of year, we at Fish, Wildlife & Parks (FWP) field lots of phone calls from hunters looking for good places to find elk. It's tempting to send some to Trixi's. Because in that spot you are literally surrounded by elk for as far as the eye can see, in abundance not surpassed in over 100

But, I do not.

True, it's more fun to send hunters to dark holes with no elk or cell phone coverage instead But, the main reason I don't send many hunters to Ovando is because of the frustrations they may en-

Jarod Raithel's report of good calf survival this summer is good news only in places like the Game Range, where numbers in excess of social tolerances and habitat capacity can be managed effectively with public hunting.

But, when elk live on expansive private lands where adequate numbers of hunters cannot gain access, high calf survival is cause for high anxiety. Next year, it will probably require a harvest of more than 120 cows and calves to stabilize a population that could have been controlled with the harvest of only 100 this fall.

My point is this. Your commitment to the protection and proper management of your public winter range—and summer range does matter, even in times of great



Ailing Man Hears Magic Words. "We Have A Heart For You" by Darcy Daugherty

Darcy and Terry Daugherty, (Darcy's Hair Designs) of Seeley Lake, would like to tell you the wonderful story about their son-inlaw, Eric Thornton, daughter Tina and granddaughter Ericka.

About two and one half years ago, after Eric Thornton, 29, a Chelan County juvenile detention officer, collapsed at home, doctors discovered that the electrical impulses in his heart didn't work properly. A pacemaker was implanted and Eric returned to work. Then last August, while strug-

gling with a belligerent juvenile, his heart started to beat out of control. Doctors replaced the pacemaker with a defibrillator that would shock his heart if he went into cardiac arrest. Since then Eric has been on medical leave and on a waiting list for a heart transplant. Chelan County employees donated hundreds of hours of vacation time. to Eric to extend his medical leave.

Tina said her husband's health had deteriorated in recent months. He was not allowed to leave the Wenatchee area. He was taking nine different medications and doctors were talking about more







