\$1,000 Reward offered for puppy stolen in Seeley Lake

On December 10th, Kelsey Brewer's puppy was stolen out of his father's unlocked white 1999 Ford Crew Cab diesel pickup while it was parked at Rovero's. His father, Eddy Brewer, said that \$25 was also taken along with the puppy.

Kelsey, a 14-year-old kid suffered a serious brain injury two years ago when he fell from the back of a pickup truck. Over the past two years, he went through five surgeries and had to learn how to walk, talk and

Now he's torn apart over the theft of his buddy that he slept with every night. Regardless of the reason the thief took the puppy, the family is pleading for its return.

"It's been awful," Shannon Brewer said. "I went to Seeley on Saturday and put up signs. The sign my husband had posted on Wednesday was gone. The poster I put up at the Valley Market was taken down not long after I put it up. Because of the signs disappearing, I'm just sure the puppy is in Seeley Lake. We aren't going to press charges, we just want our son's puppy back.



This is the time of year when reindeer fly overhead and land on rooftops. Then they're gone until next Christmas.

deer, or caribou as they are known in North America, may have lived vear-round in Montana? Yes, there were enough sightings in the Yaak and along the North Fork of the Flathead River in the late 1880s and early 1900s to suggest that a small population might have been resident.

It would make a handy stop for Santa Claus, where he could have traded tired stock for fresh ones on his annual trip around the world.

But, nowadays the closest wild caribou live about 25 miles north of the Montana border, in British Columbia, according to Dr. Kerry Foresman in his recently published guide to The Wild Mammals of Montana.

Moose, elk, mule deer, and white-tailed deer are the next closest relatives to reindeer that live in Montana, but I'm afraid it would be like running diesel fuel in a gasoline engine if Saint Nick tried to hitch them up in place of the real

> As a matter of fact, back in the 1940s and 1950s Montana Fish. Wildlife and Parks (FWP) tested the airworthiness and endurance of mountain goats in our part of the world. You'll find no reference to Santa Claus in FWP's report on the project, authored by James McLucas. The purpose of FWP's work supposedly was to restore mountain goats to native and other suitable habitats across Montana by capturing and relocating goats from areas of abundance.

But, you can't help suspecting the heavy hand of Claus when you read between the lines of the historic McLucas report. And, the exercises that the goats went through bear close resemblance to basic training for NASA astronauts. Consider the following quoted passages from McLucas:

Flathead trapping operation, a four-place Stinson plane was used. The back seat and right front seat were removed and three goats were placed on the floor. They were blindfolded and had their feet tied: a safety strap was run through their horns to hold them down. This method was fairly successful, but it is believed that if they are given a sedative, it will improve the safety factor by keeping them quieted, especially during takeoffs.

I can attest to McLucas' wisdom. Jerry Gallagher and I once rode on the smooth floor in the back of a Hughes 500 helicopter with the doors removed-each holding a struggling bighorn sheep in our arms. Jerry and I would have benefited tremendously from sedatives as our precious bundles pushed with their hooves against the front seats, inching our butts

McLucas goes on to describe a really unusual goat trap in the

ever closer to the open air.

This unique trap is located on the South Fork of the Flathead River in the Bob Marshall Wilderness Area in Montana. Where all of the other goat traps are located on ridges and mountains above 7,500 feet, this one is located on the very river edge and in high water. The lick is under water. The elevation of this trap is approximately 4,000 feet, and mountain goats have used it a great number

The photograph of the trap in the McLucas report makes it look like a floating platform on the edge of the river. So, now we know that mountain goats can fly, and they can splash down in water after reentry into the atmosphere. McLucas continues:

Shooting rapids on trip to Black Bear Ranger Station and airfield. Goats are put in crates of airplane tubing and four goats are taken per trip. About 9-1/2 miles are covered in approximately 45 reindeer appear distinctly white.


more by trail on-pack horses. The trip is much cooler and smoother than it would be by pack horse. All sizes of goats can be taken by boat whereas they would have to be selected and the smaller animals taken by pack horses

A grand total of 305 mountain

goats were put through this or other "training" programs, and were ultimately transplanted to new habitats between 1941 and 1956. Mountain goats in the Swan Range and Bob Marshall were source populations for transplants to other areas. Island mountain ranges such as the Crazy Mountains and Gates of the Mountains were destina-





One of our best retires: **Colin Moon says** farewell after 22 years

Colin Moon-Fair, genuine, trustworthy, honest, incredible and funny. Those are a few of the things mentioned when people are asked about what they think of Colin.

In May, he'll retire from Seeley Lake Volunteer Fire Department and the Clearwater DNRC (Department of Natural Resources and Conservation).

The Seeley Lake Volunteer Fire Department and QRU Christmas party focused on Colin's retirement and all he has done for the district and the department.

"Obviously it's going to be sad, because look at everything he's done for us," Seeley Lake Fire Chief Frank Maradeo said. "It's really going to be hard to recover from this for quite a while. We've still got some great people at Clearwater DNRC—Steve Wallace, Neil Carlson and Howie Kent, but we'll really miss Colin. I hope he'll wean us, and go out slowly."

District Manager Carol Wetzsteon said, "I love him; he's always there for you. I can't even imagine a fire season without him. He gives everybody a real security factor. It just

won't be the same."

He served on the Seeley Lake Volunteer Fire Department for 21 years, and served as Fire Chief twice from 1985 to 1987 and 1993 to 1995. He served on the Seelev Lake Fire District Board for nine years.

Colin has been with DNRC for 22 years; presently he's the Clearwater Unit Fire Supervisor. When you ask him what his title is at Clearwater, he puffs up his chest, catches his underarms with his thumbs and announces "Superior Fire Wizard."

Webster's Dictionary—Wizard: Magician; skillful, clever person. Yep. Clearwater Unit Manger Steve
Wallace said, "Most of the Clearwater"

His first fire was in 1969, while working for the Blackfoot Forest Pro- application. tective Association (BFPA). The BFPA worked as the fire suppression agency in this area until the costs and liabilities outweighed its ability to continue at which point fire suppression was turned over to the state.

Colin was selected for the 2000 Southwest Land Office Employee of the Year for Fire Management Award. This award goes to an employee who excels in his or her job, which includes fire suppression, detection, prevention, coordination, readiness and follow-up.

He's responsible for the SLICK office (Seelev Lake Incident Command Center), located in the Seeley Lake Fire Hall. SLICK allows the fire agencies in the area to coordinate who will respond to fires to keep three different agencies from showing up at one incident. As many of us know, during a lightening storm, 20 calls can come n within a few minutes.

He's an expert with both structure and wildland fires. Firefighting is dangerous, and Colin always put his crew's physical safety and mental health first; and when things got tight, he could always break the tension with

When people would ask him what the fire season was going to bring, he'd answer "Only fools and newcomers predict a fire season. I'll tell you in

Besides a great sense of humor. his ability to train others is beyond firstclass. He is an inspiration to so many people because of the way he supports them. He showed people how to do things over and over until they get it without degrading them.

He would take as much time as was needed to take a firefighter from insecure beginner to confident-and he had the same dedication to male and female, young and old.

One of the biggest lessons he would teach those he worked with the beginning firefighting classes. He'd take a dollar from his pocket and say, "Who would like this dollar?" The class would sit quietly for a minute or so, some would look around, and finally a few would giggle.

"No really, who wants a dollar?" Still no takers.

Then he'd say "There's no trick. I'm giving this dollar away."

Sometimes someone would raise their hand and take the dollar: in other classes he'd end up putting the dollar back in his pocket. Regardless of giving the dollar away or not, the lesson would stick with us forever.

"It's about trust," he'd finally sav. "This wasn't a trick. I offered you a dollar and you thought there had to be a catch. There was no catch. If you're going to be a firefighter, you have to learn to trust those you work with."

One of his icebreakers he'd use in class (which would usually occur within the first half-hour of any class) was when someone would raise their hand and say, "Can I ask a stupid question?" Colin would puff up his chest (he does this often), strut toward that person, grin and gently say, "Let me tell you something right now. There's no such thing as a stupid question; only stupid people," The class would roar, and then he'd answer the question. The rest of the classroom time would be spent at ease.

Firefighting runs in the family. His daughter Katherine Moon spent last summer as a first-year wildland firefighter at the Swan DNRC Unit. His father. Gareth Moon, spent 30 years as the State Forester, and also served as the Forestry Commissioner of State Lands until he retired due to health

Colin says his father started with fire before there were any trees. He then boasts that he has been with the DNRC since 1953. "Yep, my dad was started out when he'd stand in front of appointed State Forester the year

Foundation awards grants

Four grants totaling \$4,702 were awarded to local not-for-profit organizations by the Seeley Lake Community Foundation.

The Lions Club received \$500 towards the purchase of eye screening machines that will be used in the Seeley Lake Elementary School and other neighboring schools.

The Boy Scout Troop # 19 received \$250 toward the purchase of tents for winter camping activities.

The Seeley Lake Senior Citizens received \$1,500 to help finance a garage for their bus and Seeley Swan High School was granted \$2,452 to acquire structural support for lighting, sound and decorative materials for high school, grade school, and 2 Valleys Stage productions.

A second round of small grants will be awarded in May. The Foundation is also planning to announce a \$1,000 scholarship beginning with the SSHS class of 2004.

Since the Seeley Lake Community Foundation was founded four years ago, it has raised over \$200,000 in grants and donations.

Loren Rose. President of the Foundation said, "the successful fundraising dinner/auction in September has allowed us to launch the small grants program and begin to plan for a scholarship for high school

The SLCF is associated with the Montanan Community Foundation, which invests the endowment funds, earnings from which finance part of the local Small Grants Program.

\$42,000 in community assistance grants, in the areas of education, arts & culture, economic development, natural resources & conservation and basic human needs.
